

She is the Co-founding Director of the New Leaf Collaborative (NLC) a California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation whose mission is to provide hands-on, experiential learning and leadership opportunities, in areas of science, nature and ecological literacy in order to nurture the social and emotional health of students, educators, and community partners. She explained that NLC does this through several programs in and out of schools throughout Contra Costa County where program outcomes are guided by social and emotional learning standards and create connection to place, community, and civic engagement. NLC strives to cultivate healthy communities and individuals, intellectually curious learners and responsible, ecologically literate citizens that are connected to each other and the planet.

She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics from San Francisco State University (SFSU), a Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from University of the Pacific, a clear California Geosciences teaching credential and a certificate in nonprofit management from California State University, East Bay. After graduating from SFSU, Ellen worked as an equity trader and client relations manager in post venture capital distribution management for over ten years before seeking a vocational path in education. In 2012 Ellen was inspired by the Community Science Workshop model of learning by doing which led her to seek collaborative partners who helped start NLC's first school site Community Science Workshop. Ellen then earned her teaching credential and

Master's Degree and taught middle school science for eight years before committing full time to her role as Executive Director. Ellen is excited to help inspire more students to learn about science, feel more connected to each other and our planet, and innovate our way to a sustainable future.

As a former runner and triathlete, Ellen now enjoys walking her dog, playing bocce on Sunday nights with her team in the Martinez Bocce Federation, hiking with friends, enjoying live music in local venues, riding her e-bike with her husband and spending time with their granddaughter. She and her husband reside in Martinez with their daughter who is currently studying kinesiology at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. They live close to their son, his partner, and their 6 month old daughter.


CVCSR CHARITABLE MATCHING FUND

HAPPYBUCKS BARBARA REIFSCHNEIDER




IRENE DAVIDS-BLAIR


